BAP Success...

I purchased a pair of **Lepidiolamprologus Hecqui** from Tim Craig when he was selling off his fish room. My interest in shell dwellers led me to the purchase. They were young breeders, but even at that size, I had to get much bigger shells than the ones I previously used for *Neolamprologus multifasciatus*. I quarantined them in a 10 gallon tank for a few weeks to acclimate them to my fish room. Within a short time, I spotted many perfectly round, white eggs in the shell. The female remained crammed in the shell most of the day. The male kept guard on the outside. After a time, I had fry. Since the tank was small, I moved the pair to its next stage and left the fry to grow up in the 10 gallon. I've kept the Hecqui with a big group of Frontosa for the better part of two years. They can really hold their own. Given a cichlid cave made by Pleco Caves, those Hecqui spawned numerous times over the years. I recently sent the pair off to Atlanta. I've had only good experiences with this fish. I'd recommend it to anyone.

This Month in OCA History

Lew Carbone, OCA Historian

1991: A "Fish Flea Market" (Swap Meet) is the program for the social meeting, held at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Hinckley. Registration for sellers is \$2 and a 50/50 auction is held afterward for sellers not wanting to take all their unsold bags home.

1992: In his editorial in this month's BCLS, editor Dan McMonigle proudly announces that, after three years of monthly payments, the OCA now owns the copier outright. The copier is used to print the BCLB. Dan says this is just in time so the OCA can marshal its resources to make a strong bid for the 1994 ACA convention.

1993: At November's OCA board meeting, a proposal was made to limit BCLB publication to odd-numbered months. As a constitutional matter, the proposal would have to be approved by the membership. At this months' social meeting, after hearing a speech against the proposal by charter member Rich Schoeffel, the membership voted it down.

What's Important?...

BAGGING YOUR FISH PROPERLY FOR AUCTION. It's a big pain to bag fish, especially after a Saturday night at an Extravaganza. Bagging properly, however, is the most important thing you can do to ensure your fish go for big bucks. The care taken to bag your fish increases the price someone will pay for the fish. It shows that if the seller cares enough to bag properly, he/she must put care into the fish inside the bag. Bags that are not properly bagged can lose air and water, leaving the fish and the buyer in a bad position. Few people want to rescue a fish after a long weekend. Few people want considerably lower checks for simple misbagging of fish. Remember, a hundred people could potentially be picking up and placing down your fish. That's a lot of movement. Take the time necessary to bag with care, and enjoy the profits you deserve.

P.S. – I was **really** impressed with this year's bagging overall. Personally handling most of the bags, there were few leaks and no big disasters. Great job!
