September Program Preview Dr. Jay Stauffer "Behaviors of Malawi Cichlids"

Dr. Jay Stauffer holds the title of Distinguished Professor of Ichthyology at Pennsylvania State University. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree at Cornell and his PhD at Virginia Tech. Over the years he has held field, lab and classroom positions at Ichthyological Associates (Lancaster, PA), Cornell, Virginia Tech and the University of Maryland. He started at Penn State as Associate Professor in 1984 and earned his current title in 2006.

His academic interests include endangered fish species, freshwater fish behavior, the impact of non-native fish species in local ecologies, and the systematics (to over-simplify, the study of how species are related to each other) of freshwater fishes. He has had a special interest in the fishes of Lake Malawi for about 30. You can either thank him (if you are interested in the true relationships between cichlid species) or blame him (if you are annoyed by species' name changes) for the following: He, along with other researchers such as Ad Konings, has played a big part in the splitting and re-organizing of Lake Malawi cichlid genera. An example would be when, in the 1990s, Metrioclima and Tropheops were split off of Pseudotropheus.

Dr. Stauffer has spoken at 6 Extravaganzas. He was the winner of the 2011 Jim Smith Fund grant, and reported on the work he did with it when he spoke at our August, 2012 meeting. He then won part of the 2012 prize, for a project that involved making and organizing video footage of Malawi cichlid behavior, and we'll see some of the fruits of that project at this month's meeting.

The title of Dr Stauffer's talk is "Behaviors of Malawi Cichlids".

Next month, we'll meet professional collector and importer Brian Perkins as he discusses the "Cichlids of Peru".

Some species of fish are quite an investment of time, food, patience, resources, space, and many other requirements. We challenge ourselves to raise these fish because the reward has the potential to be much bigger than the investment. The Amphilophus species are great examples of big rewards with great investment. There are many different species in the genus and they all have unique qualities that are usually shadowed by their feared, tankbuster reputations. To raise a group of Amphilophus fry from .5" to adulthood is a phenomenal experience. There's so much growth in maturity throughout their lives. They are multidimensional creatures with so much to offer nature. In my relatively short BAP career, I've always had one group of Amphilophus cycling through its life. So far I've bred flaveolus, sp. red islatus, hogaboomorum, and now I have Trimacs growing out. It's my goal to successfully breed all the species of Amphilophus.

1989:

At this month's board meeting, Don Danko proposes some changes to the class list for the 1990 Cichlid Show. They include the addition of "Best New World Cichlid" and "Best Old World Cichlid" and the split of the Cichlasoma class into "6 inches and over" and "under 6 inches". (In those days, in common usage, Cichlasoma included almost every Mexican and Central American Cichlid, as well as many more South Americans than it does now.) The first time inclusion of several "scavenger" classes was also discussed.

1993:

Dave Ayres is appointed by President Marc DeWerth to fill the Vice President's position after it was vacated by the elected VP because of "personal obligations."

2004:

Possibly because of personnel changes, the management at the Hampton Inn on Tiedeman Road, in Brooklyn, lost track of the reservation calendar for their meeting room. Consequently, our normal venue was double-booked for the 1st Friday in September, and the OCA had to hastily arrange for some space at the Holiday Inn, Strongsville, for this month's meeting. The speaker is Ken McGill, who demonstrates methods of culturing live food.
